**PS. "Don't wait for the hearse to take you to church!"**

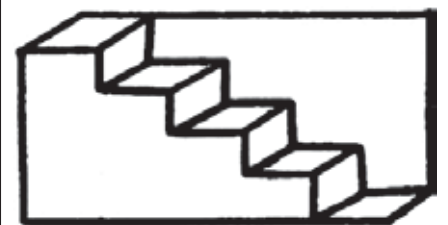


Turn this picture over. Look at it again. What do you see?
