- ◆ Layers of mud and sediment would have **SUDDENLY** covered plants and animals so they would be turned into fossils, rather than simply decay. - They did.

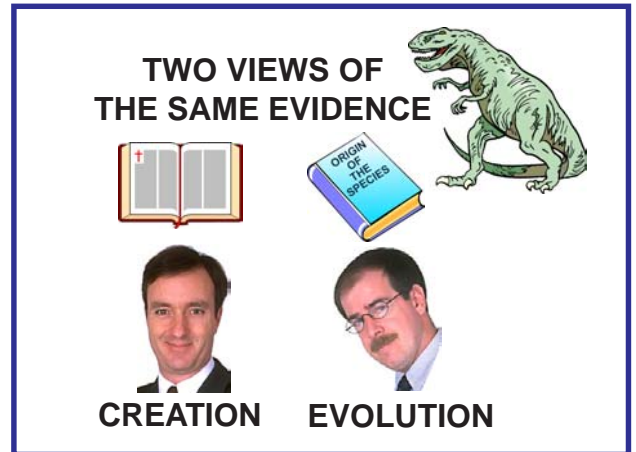
I look at the evidence present today, read my Bible, and by faith believe in God as creator.
